

### **Can infections also be a sign of diabetes?**

Our body always encounters many microbes, but the most important condition for them to cause disease is low resistance.

If diabetes is not controlled, it is a disease that lowers the body's resistance.

For this reason, simple infections can be seen much more frequently in an irregular course of diabetes, or they progress more rapidly.

The most common infections in diabetes are urinary tract infections, fungal infections that occur in the genitals and toes - nails.

Rare fungal infections, which are only seen in diseases with low body resistance such as diabetes, can sometimes be life-threatening.
